In the month of December, we continued with the Tree study. We have learned and discussed the different parts of the tree, where trees grow, how a tree can stay strong on the ground, types of trees, the life cycle of a tree, and the different shapes we can see that a tree can form. We also learned about the colors of leaves, why we can see different colors of leaves in different seasons, the animals that live in trees, and what type of nest they make in trees. Additionally, we learned what foods we get from trees, and what other materials we get from trees to use in our everyday lives. We investigated the tree's bark, the animals living on the tree, and the types of trees they saw outdoors. The 4-year-old children collected the tree parts and completed a project on their collection. Along with the tree study, we continue to practice rhyming words, opposites, and compound words. They have a nicely crafted Christmas tree and a snowman to celebrate this festive month. Next month, in the new year, we will start learning about buildings.
